**'Social Policy'** covers a broad range of policy issues and investigates public attitudes to key areas of the welfare state in an age of austerity, as well as exploring the ideas and institutions that help bring together a fragmented society, in addition to rising loneliness and social isolation. The programme aims to develop strategic approaches to the UK's biggest domestic social policy challenges. Priority research areas in 2017 include welfare and public service reform, social mobility, integration, harm prevention and security.

Demos is now seeking interns to support its fast-growing **'International Projects'** research programme - a global, collaborative research strand, taking a comparative view to emerging social and cultural issues, national and global citizenship, and charting best practice in public policy-making and innovation. The programme gives particular emphasis to social and political change, including populism, the future of liberalism, and the relationship between politics and the media. We invite applications from students with an interest in exploring the roots and manifestations of these issues, and with a demonstrated interest in European history or politics.

The newly formed **'Modern Economy'** programme explores the major issues facing the UK Government and our industries, from the changing nature of work and the workforce, to the challenge of negotiating Britain's exit from the EU. The programme will also produce innovative and forward-thinking new research and events on the next frontier of opportunities for inclusive economic growth.

**‘CASM – the Centre for Analysis of Social Media’** combines computer science with social science to analyse social media and develops social media analysis as a valid instrument of research that meets the needs of policy and decision-makers.
